1. FLA – increase the number of signed license agreements or confirmation of open data, confirm the technical contacts and inform CORDA



2. Engagement – engage with members to encourage data provision, through emails, webinars and meetings. Support CORDA by responding to direct requests, and data requirements

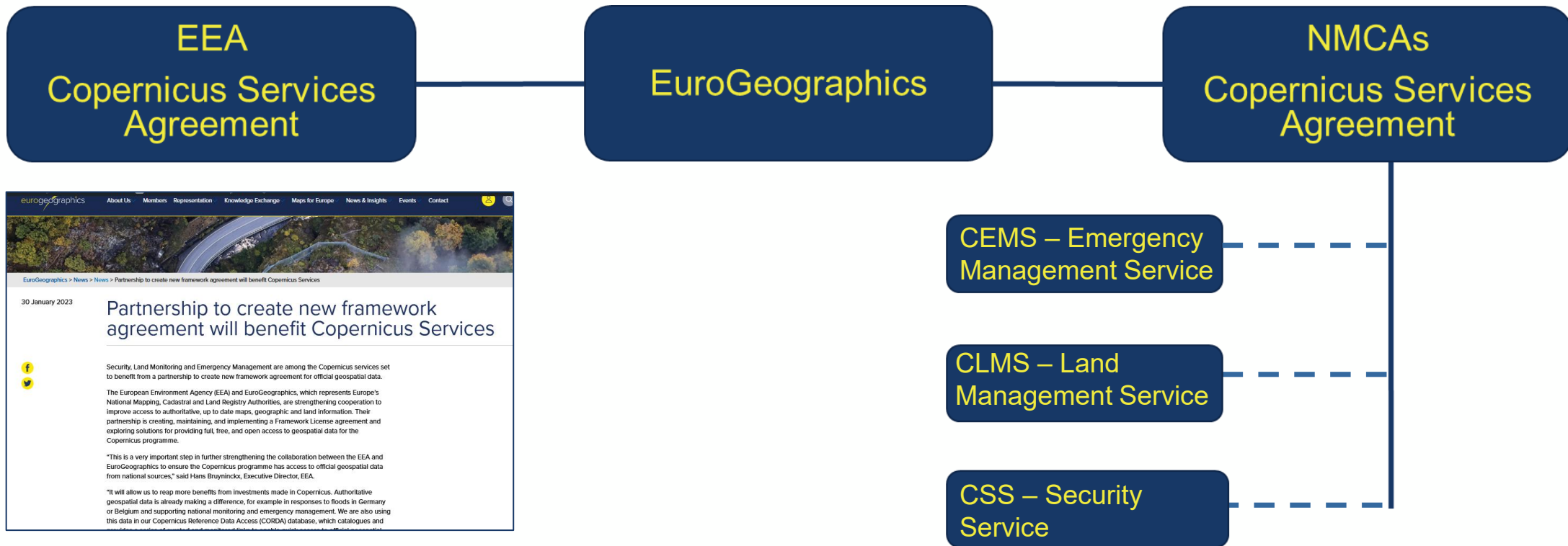

1. Licensing Framework



The importance of licensing your data to Copernicus Services

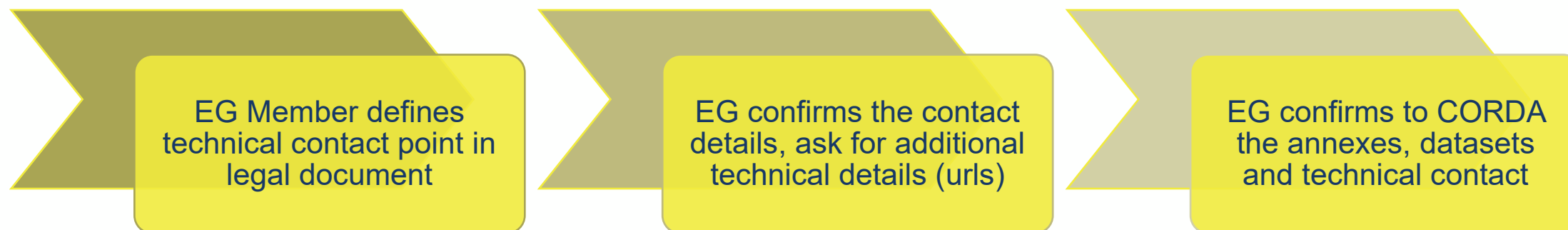
- Without in-situ data, the Copernicus Programme simply cannot deliver its data, products and services
- Access to your official data helps meet end user requirements regarding content and quality
- The process developed enables better access to members data and allows for more members data to be included to the Copernicus Services
- Ensure that the three services are using official data and not unofficial sources where applicable
- It also allows for increased data delivery from EuroGeographics members in the future
- Ensuring that National Mapping, Cadastral and Land Registration Authorities are recognised for their essential contributions to Copernicus

Technical contacts

- Once the legal permissions are agreed we need to confirm the technical access

Open data

- Many of your organisations now have open data and so don't want to sign agreement
- When Oliwia contacts your organisation:
 - Please confirm to us that the data is open
 - If there is a specific link to your GeoPortal please confirm this so we can inform CORDA
 - We still need a technical contact please
 - This should not be an info@... or contact@... email address if possible

2. Engagement

Understand the requirements of the end user and focus activity via:



Dedicated emails; as directed by CORDA specific emails to certain members



1:1 meetings with members



Run dedicated data campaigns as directed by CORDA (e.g. for specific datasets)



Member webinars; updates and requirements communicated to members



Act as an intermediary for CORDA if and when required

3. ECRM / Cadastral Data Synergies



Understanding user requirements

Feedback on the specifications of ECRM to shape development



Duplication of effort

Reduce duplication of effort, save costs and focus investment



Provision of harmonised data across Europe

Open feedback is encouraged during this development process.

CORDA provides authorised users with a centralised gateway for accessing geospatial reference data from the European countries participating in the Copernicus Programme.

The increase is made possible by the Copernicus Services Framework agreement between EuroGeographics and the European Environment Agency (EEA) – specifically the Copernicus In Situ component. By streamlining the licensing process, it provides a practical solution for overcoming legal barriers to data access for the Copernicus Services for disaster response and recovery, security and land monitoring.
