

## CLRKEN – Work Plan 2018 / 2019

### 1. General

#### 1.1 Aim of document

The aim of the work plan is to set out and make transparent the activities of the CLRKEN of EuroGeographics for the next 12-24 months.

In that regard, the work plan is a guiding document for the Core Team and other members. It is to be reviewed on a regular basis, ideally annually. It is to be put on the CLRKEN web pages.

#### 1.2 Mission and objectives of CLRKEN

The mission and objectives of the CLRKEN are to:

- maintain a network of cadastral and land registry experts;
- provide the European platform for networking and sharing best practice;
- follow the development of relevant technologies and practices;
- support EuroGeographics' policy towards European data interoperability;
- promote our member's experiences and expertise;
- raise awareness of the importance of cadastre and land registry for economic activity and social development;
- organize workshops in the field of cadastre and land administration;
- publish reports on issues in the field of land administration.

The CLRKEN focuses on the role of cadastre (documenting the property objects) and land registry (documenting legal rights in properties) and investigates developments that affect these fields.

#### 1.3 Activities of the CLRKEN

The CLRKEN plans the following activities for its members:

- to organize two **workshops** for all CLRKEN members per year, based on the preferences of its members.

These activities are to be coordinated with other institutions, organizations, and parties active in our field.

#### 1.4 Activities of the CLRKEN-Core Team

The activities of the CLRKEN are organized and coordinated by the Core Team consisting of 6-8 members. Over the course of one year, the Core Team is planning the following activities:

- to hold 1 **face-to-face meeting** of the Core Team (preferably early in the year) in order to review the work plan, to plan and organize up-coming workshops, to coordinate activities with partners, and to decide on workshop topics and possibly a report, dealing with those topics; invite the incoming PCC chair in order to discuss common goals;
- to keep regular contact among the Core Team members through 3-4 **web meetings** per year;
- to organize 2 **workshops** for all CLRKEN members in cooperation with partners;
- to make workshop results easily accessible for members;
- to maintain **CLRKEN webpages** on the EuroGeographics website.

The "Common Vision" agreement signed on 30 Nov. 2012 by EuroGeographics, PCC, ELRA, and EULIS is the basis for the planning of the CLRKEN activities. The CLREN aims to coordinate, organize, and hold workshops jointly with those organizations. In practice, the potential overlap is biggest with PCC in terms of topics and participants; therefore the CLRKEN tries to coordinate its activities with the PCC chairs well in advance, mainly because they are changing every 6 months. The CLRKEN will also consider to cooperate more – where possible – with UN-GGIM:Europe and liaise with other KENs of EuroGeographics.

## 2. Specifics

### 2.1 Current topics to focus on

- Privacy and GDPR (General Data Protection Rules)
- CLR: integrated/joint organization or separate, experiences, lessons learnt
- how to attract younger generation to our profession (cooperate with YSN of FIG), DVW (Arbeitsplatz Erde)
- cadastral index map as part of ELS, use for other purposes
- Expert meeting on cadastral map improvements (examples from DK, NO, CZ, SF, SE, AT, CH, NL, SLV, DE)
- best practice of administrative processes in land administration (maybe joint event with WPLA) (including results of crowd sourcing questionnaire by François Chirié)
- 250 years of Danish land surveyors
- automation of our processes (legal and technical)

### 2.2 Planned workshops

CLRKEN will keep the contacts with its partner organizations and explore possible joint workshops and events. Partners include PCC, ELRA, WPLA, FIG-Commission 7, EULIS, CLGE, UN-GGIM, FIG-YSN.
